Plan Bay Area – January 2012 workshops

The Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) will hold the next round of Plan Bay Area public workshops in January 2012. By then they expect to have a set of clearly defined scenarios that illustrate different housing/jobs distribution and transportation infrastructure investments. The scenarios will be evaluated as to how well they help the region achieve the 15 percent per-capita greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reduction targets and other Plan Bay Area Performance Targets. It would be good to have several League members at each of these workshops.

KRCB-TV in Sonoma County is received all around the Bay. The station has long worked with LWV Sonoma County to present election forums. KRCB is interested in expanding its election coverage into the South Bay, East Bay, and San Francisco. Before communicating with Stan Marvin, review these points--

* KRCB will need notification of a pending program at least 60 days prior to any suggested date of broadcast.

* KRCB will need to receive a completed program of standard length (approx 27 minutes or approx 57 minutes) on a compatible tape or video file format at least 10 business days prior to broadcast.

* KRCB will require standard broadcast waivers from all on-camera participants. (Standard form available from KRCB)

* KRCB Public Television broadcasts from studios in Rohnert Park, California on digital channels 22.1, 22.2 & 22.3 and is seen over-the-air throughout much of the San Francisco Bay Area.

* KRCB is also seen on Channel 22 via Comcast Cable, AT&T U-verse, DISH an DirecTV satellite services across the entire San Francisco Bay Area.
