Regional ballot measures supported by the LWVBA were approved: AA - BART seismic bonds, BB- AC Transit Parcel Tax, and CC - East Bay Regional Park District; all requiring 2/3 voter support,. Of the six transportation tax measures on the county ballots, all but Solano County carried, again with more than 2/3 approval.
